

Community Internship Student Data

The results displayed below are a combined representation of two independent surveys (2014 and 2015). A combined total of 194 student responses were collected across both surveys, and given the similarity of results, are reported here as a combined pattern of findings. The surveys were conducted to inform the best practice approaches to the recruitment, allocation and education of students. The surveys included a number of demographic and other course related items as well as a number of Likert-scale attitudinal items, measuring satisfaction with Griffith attributes and personal and professional development as after participating in the community internship course. The invitation to participate in Community Internship surveys were sent to 432 students who completed the course in a series of semesters extending from semester 1 2012 to semester 2 2013. This is a selection of the results from these surveys.

Figure 2. Percentage of students intending to volunteer in the future as a result of participating in the community internship course

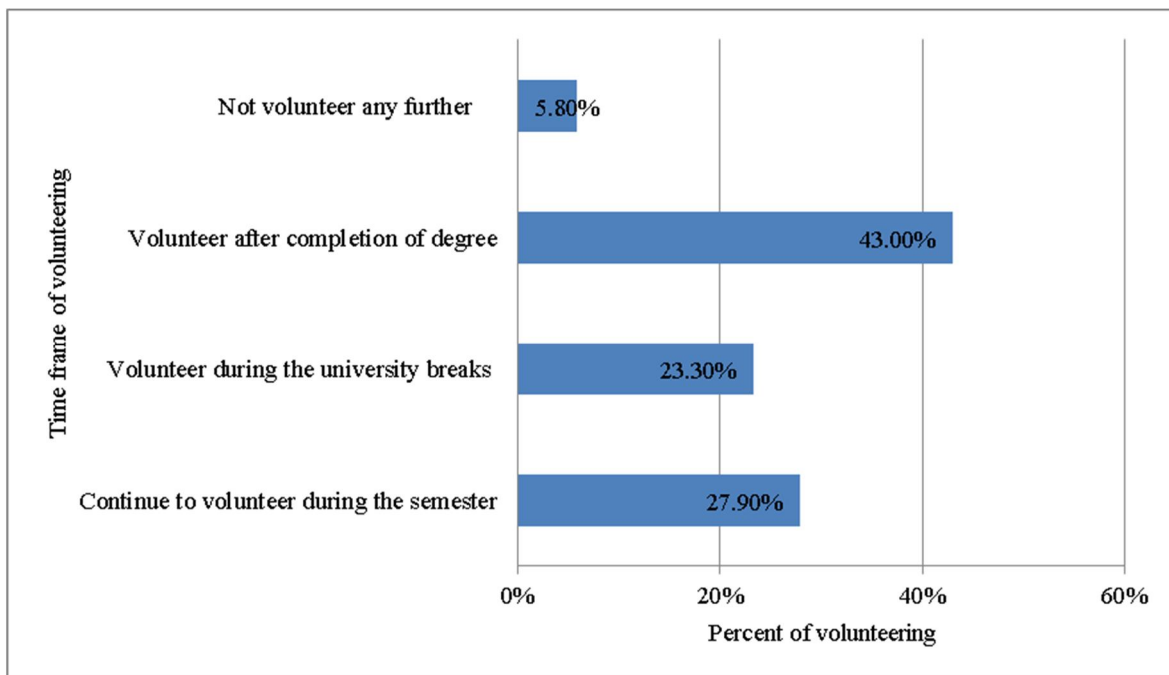


Figure 3: The percentage of student agreeableness on professional and personal development as a result of participating in the community internship course

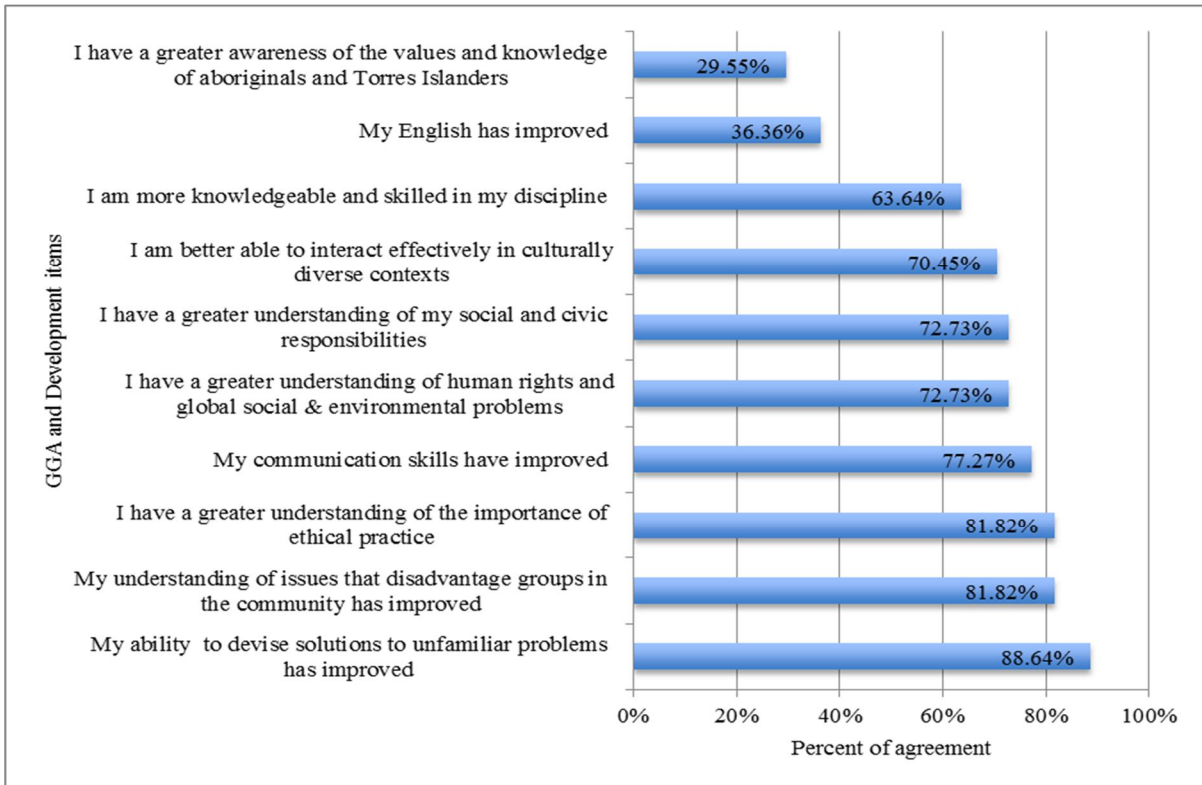


Figure 4: Percent of students expressing overall satisfaction about the community internship course experience
