The story of this painting is about indigenous women and their birthing journey with midwives, the red represents our blood, the blue represents the water, and the white represents smoke.

That is a traditional practice that indigenous women do, the water cleanses our baby's bodies, and the blood is the connection to our babies.

The two waterholes represent woman's spiritual waterholes were they give birth, the woman moves her hips in a dancing movement to make it easier for the safe arrival of her baby.

The four spiritual women are watching over our women, the middle part is the woman's birthing ceremony and together with the midwives and other women they can help each other. The symbols that go around in the circle represent women.

The hands on the background reflect that we need many hands to rise above as women though birthing.

This is a spiritual birthing journey we are taking together with the help of midwives from the beginning of the pregnancy right though till the babies born and onwards, and to make that friendship together on this journey.
